Cuba is Alive: Photography by Lena Konstantakou

A Greek-born photographer and graphic designer, Lena Konstantakou has enjoyed great success in both Greek and British media. Having had her work appear in a number of reputable publications, including The Sunday Telegraph, Taxidromos (Ta Nea newspaper), and the FIFA World Cup Korea/Japan official guide, Konstantakou felt stymied by the rigmarole of her daily commercial practice, and this exhibition marks her return to her original love of photography for the creative freedom it nurtures. As such, Cuba is Alive brings together a selection of photographs that forge an intimate and exuberant documentary of the country, in which Konstantakou who uses film and transparency film for all her images, feels she "both escaped and arrived."

Konstantakou is preoccupied with ideas of passion, warmth and freedom, manifest most explicitly in her intimate portraits of the nation's citizens. Cuba's people are captured in the midst of their daily routine, and they seem refreshingly unperturbed by, almost unaware of, the artist's presence. This subtlety allows Konstantakou to capture her subjects in such intimate moments as a father and son playing a game across the bedroom tiles, an exhausted woman fetching water to bring home to her children, or a man lost in thought before silhouettes of the city. The diptych Soap Opera shows a boy burst into laughter, his face illuminated by the light of his family's favourite television show from the Fifties, a touching sequence that cements the artist's place as one and the same as her subjects.

Cuban Family is one of the show's most intriguing works, a family portrait in which Konstantakou's camera exists as a secondary lens. A father gathers his children on a beach in order to photograph this tender family event for posterity. Konstantakou's camera is not far behind, however, documenting the sentimental moment in a scene that seems far from contemporary. The timeless nature evoked by the artist's employment of black and white film is echoed in the children's beach attire, rich with echoes of the past and by proxy the struggles through which the country has battled. The sole giveaway that indicates this photo is contemporary rather than archival, is the digital camera held aloft by the proud father, but even this cannot quite shake the notion that we are instead privy to a historical document from the Sixties. The children boldly pose for the photograph, exhibiting the determination, resilience, and energy they would have inherited from generations before. It is this sense of quiet patriotism that exudes throughout these photographs, through both the nation's people, and its hot and sticky landscapes, each of which evinces the stillness that comes only in the aftermath of a tropical storm.

Cleverly amplified by the inclusion of Ivan Pothecary's (father of photographer Andrew) never-before-seen candid shots of Fidel Castro at an airport on the island of Trinidad c.1958, Cuba is Alive overwhelms the habit of the media for showing only headline-stealing images of Cuban riots, press conferences, and protests. In so doing, Konstantakou succeeds in documenting a side of the nation that is often overlooked by the very industry in which the artist has made her name.
